**CALL TO ORDER AND WELCOME**

Mayor Boyd called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone.

**APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### **Amendment to Dog Ordinance (Second Reading)**

Councilman Sikes made a motion to approve amending the City of Metter's Dog Ordinance to expand ordinance in the best interest of the public. Councilwoman Kilcrease seconded the motion, and the vote was unanimous. (Second Reading)

#### **Resolution Declaring Surplus Property**

Councilwoman Kilcrease made a motion to approve a resolution declaring the following equipment as surplus allowing staff to advertise in the Metter Advertiser and on GovDeal.com:

#### **Metter Depot HVAC Replacement Project**

Councilman Sikes made a motion to approve a bid from Collins & Sons Heating & Air in the amount of \$22,233.00 for the HVAC Replacement Project at the Metter Depot. Councilwoman Kilcrease seconded the motion, and the vote was unanimous.

Councilwoman Taylor arrived at the meeting during this time.

#### **Purchase of Zero Turn Riding Lawnmower**

Councilwoman Kilcrease made a motion to approve a bid from Quik-Kut, Inc. in the amount of \$15,899.00 for the purchase of a new zero turn riding lawnmower for the

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streets and lanes department. Councilman Sikes seconded the motion, and the vote was unanimous.

### **Purchase of a 2022 Ford Police Interceptor Utility**

Councilwoman Kilcrease made a motion to purchase a 2022 Ford Police Interceptor Utility from Metter Ford for an amount of \$47,204.70. Councilman Sikes seconded the motion, and the vote was unanimous.

Mr. Crawford reported that the city received the second round of ARPA funds last Friday in the amount of \$736,043.
